There were only two persons from Canada inducted this year, Sensei Steve and his father, Sensei Ed Hiscoe. Both were inducted as Master Jiu-Jitsu Instructors. Sensei Steve was also inducted into the "Executive Protective" category for saving a man's life while in England in June 98.

At the award ceremonies were inductees from the U.S. and also from England, New Zealand.

This year another category was introduced and that was to honour the youth in martial arts.

Many new friendships were made and old friendships were renewed.

The weather in Cleveland was a little cold but the sun was nice and bright. A visit to the Rock and Rock Hall of Fame was also part of the agenda.
